Arcade Saloon

After a town is founded, one of the first establishments to start business is a saloon. In its early years, Galt had 15 of them, almost four times as many as churches. That would be typical of Western towns of the late 19th Century. Charles Quiggle built the Arcade Saloon on 5th Street between A and B Streets in 1875. Shortly after that, he built the Arcade Livery Stable right next door. As one can tell from the photo, the Arcade Saloon also housed a bowling alley and a pool hall. This was also the height of the Temperance Movement (a movement against the consumption of alcohol) which led to the demise of the saloon. Rumor has it that a group of ladies from a local church set fire to the Arcade Saloon in 1885. Since they were both made of wood and attached to each other, the Arcade Livery Stable went with it. According to newspaper accounts of the day, that was the only saloon in town to meet that fate. Thanks to Rocky Roberts for the photo donation.

Policy and Procedure Review

Membership Committee

We do not send out invoices. Everyone who pays yearly, your dues are due and payable in January 2019. You can send a check to: Galt Area Historical Society, PO Box 782, Galt 95632; or pay by PayPal through our website: www.qalthistory.org.

If you are not a Life Member, you might consider it. It is onetime fee.

I. Purpose

The GAHS Membership Committee assists in ensuring a viable body of members is sustained who support the Mission of the GAHS. It does this by assisting in recruiting and renewing new and existing members; maintaining an accurate list of pertinent information regarding each member; and engaging members in the shared mission of "Preserving the Irreplaceable" by keeping members informed regarding volunteering oppotunities and membership events.

III. Procedure

- Membership dues are due during the month of January of the following year, unless a membersha paid close to thend of the calendar year (on or after October 1). If that is the case, renewal is due a year later. It is not the policy of the GAHS to prorate dues.
- 2. Dues are as follows:
 - a. Individual (I) \$20 yearly
 - b. Family (F) \$40 yearly
 - c. Student (S) \$10 yearly
 - d. Individual Lifetime (IF) \$200 one time
 - e. Family Lifetime (FL) \$250 one time
 - f. Small Business (SB) \$50 yearly
 - g. Honorary Life (HL) free (must be approved by GAHS Board - see Bylaws Article 3, Section 6)

- 3. Most new membership applications are mailed to the Society address and then forwarded to the Membership Chairperson. Others may come through the website and PayPal. These should also be forwarded to the Membership Chairperson. Address changes or any other pertinent information regarding members should be forwarded to the "Tower Views" newsletter editor in order to keep an up-to-date mailing list.
- 4. Membership Chairperson shall forward dues (checks, cash, PayPal documentation) to the Treasurer with a list detailing the name of the member, check number, amount, and type of membership. Membership Chairperson will provide the member a receipt upon request.
- 5. Membership Chairperson shall update the Excel Membership Master List from the applications. The updated Membership Master List should be printed and given to the President on a quarterly basis.
- 6. Membership Chairperson shall ensure that new members are mailed/emailed a Membership Packet which can include: Membership Card, "Thank You' letter, "Welcome" letter, Release of Liability form, and a Member Interest Survey.
- 7. Completed applications and Release of Liability forms should be property stored and available to the GAHS Board. Lifetime and Honoary Life applications should be kept permanently. All other "yearly" membership applications should be kept for three years and then can be shred.

Eccentrics

Galt has had its' share of eccentrics. Who remembers "Hairy Spring Hairy"? He had a tiny little building: by tiny I mean 10 foot by 10 foot, right along the street where Galt Historical Society Hall sits today. It stood on blocks about 4 inches x 4 inches. He also had seven or eight Guinea Pigs. They would scurry under the building when someone walked by. He had a thick, bushy black beard with hair to match. He always wore a black suit. There was a VERY small window beside a door but no sign or anything. I was always curious, but no one ever told me anything. I was about five years old.

There was another man who was large, red haired that walked the streets carrying a long pointed stick which he used as a walking stick. He was frightening to many who didn't know him. He was over six foot tall and as he walked he would point the stick and shout "CHARGE". He did yard work and talked to himself. He was really a pitiful old fellow. He had made a great deal of money and then two men convinced him to invest in a large building along the highway about half way between Galt and Sacramento. They managed to cut him out and he had nothing left.

He was an Irish man and expected to retire and go home to Ireland. As he worked he could be heard beating himself. "Serves you right; you should have known better."


If you or anyone you know would like to help Ida Denier during Pioneer Days for the school children, please contact Ida. She can tell you the criteria and give the training for this task.


Christmas Open House


Lighting of the Night Parade

There are those in our membership who believe in the paranormal and those who don't (judging by some of the snickering or was that nervous squirming at the last meeting). I couldn't resist the temptation to use the video application on my cell phone. I pointed it into one of the dark rooms and within a few minutes, captured orbs moving across the room. After a couple of hours and a few more "events," Ryan left and was quite impressed with what he found.

If you would like to see some of the videos, go online to YouTube and type in Ryan Privee. Scroll down, and you will find the topic "Rae House spirit ghost investigation paranormal." Experience for yourself. Some of the noise you hear is a "spirit box" that makes white noise or loud noises so that the spirits can communicate. Whether you believe or not, it was interesting to experience another form of Galt History.


